The term Sambrani is coined by Ayurveda (an ancient system of medicine) for the yellow resin, a gum-like substance that comes from perfumed bark of Sal tree. The sap is extracted from the tree by making an incision in the bark of the tree. This herbal



resin is then collected and processed in the form of minute granules that are pressed hard to form crystals of Sambrani. It emits a pleasant balsamic fragrance when burned on a charcoal tablet.

It is commonly used in the home for daily prayers, offering to God in temples, in offices, while meditating and in festivals.





CUP HANDLING

BURN CUPS LIKE THIS OPTION 2 : ALWAYS USE TONG (CHIMTA) TO HOLD THE CUP WHILE BURNING.

BURN CUPS LIKE THIS OPTION 3 : PLACE IT ON SURFACE/PLATE THEN IGNITE IT.
